








Riley, B., 1961.

- exploration of visual perception
- employs geometric patterns, lines, and colors to create optical illusions that evoke sensations of movement and vibration on static surfaces
- delves into how we see, emphasizing the dynamic nature of visual perception
- engaging viewers in a dialogue between the artwork and their perception








Colour Manipulation

- Shifting the emotional tone of the work by contrasting black-and-white to vibrant hues > energetic
- Using gradient to evoke a sense of movement or progression > shift from a formal to atmospheric dimension











• Introducing rough edges through scratching into oil pastel layers, breaking the sharpness of Riley's clean lines > more organic and chaotic effect






















I cut halfway through the paper in the middle grids to create a more opaque look







Speed and light

- Changing the speed of movement > perception of urgency or tension
- Exploring movement and distance of light from the pattern > depth through opaque and transparent grid


